### **Opportunities and Announcements**

#### FSA Application Deadline on March 16th!

If you have not already visited your local Farm Service Agency (FSA) county office to make your election for either the Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) or the Price Loss Coverage (PLC) program and to sign your annual enrollment contract, you should call and make your appointment now. March 16, 2020 is the enrollment deadline for the 2019 crop year.

#### Plenty! Accepting Applicants for Civic Agriculture Internship

This position is ideal for someone who is interested, but not yet experienced in farming and food security. The focus of this internship will be learning through participating in the daily workings of high density regenerative vegetable growing. This includes the basics of growing, tending, harvesting, seed saving, and distributing vegetables and fruits. Although the focus of this internship is developing basic healthy farming practices, we will also cover forest and watershed management, developing land based community, and many other topics that tie into our practices as people on the land. #### Farmer grant opportunity from Little Sesame

<u>Little Seedlings</u> is our initiative to fund support of our next generation of local farmers. We are excited to share that award monies this year have increased to \$10,000, which will be given as two \$5,000 grants, and awarded via our nonprofit partner organization, the <u>National Young Farmers Coalition</u>. The Little Seedlings <u>application</u> is open to those who are *currently farming in DC, Maryland or Virginia*, and will remain open until Tuesday, March 31st.

#### **VDACS Specialty Crop Grant Program Funding Opportunity**

Groups seeking to improve the competitiveness of specialty crops in Virginia are eligible to submit proposals for grants up to \$60,000 per project. The Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) anticipates administering nearly \$540,000 in funds for the development of specialty crops. The deadline for submitting applications is March 23, 2019. <a href="Individual producers are not eligible for grants">Individual producers are not eligible for grants</a>. Agricultural associations, industry and producer groups, community-based organizations, educational institutions and non-profits may submit applications to VDACS for United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service Specialty Crop Block Grants.
