### 2018 South Atlantic Hops Conference to be held at Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech will host the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual South Atlantic Hops Conference March 2nd and 3rd, 2018. The conference is a joint effort involving North Carolina State University, Virginia Tech, Virginia Cooperative Extension, Virginia State University, and the Old Dominion Hops Cooperative. The South Atlantic Hops Conference was initiated to bring together hop growers, Extension educators, researchers, brewers, and other stakeholders for the purposes of providing access to industry resources and networks, improving hop grower and prospective grower education, increasing brewing product quality and safety, and exploring regional hops production and marketing opportunities.

The 2018 conference - themed "Hops University" - is a two-day event for growers, brewers, and other stakeholders. The Friday, March 2nd program offers a morning *beginner and prospective grower* track along with an *experienced grower* track. Attendees in both tracks will reconvene in the afternoon for keynote speakers, followed by a "Hoppy Hour" networking reception. Attendees will have opportunities to visit with vendors and view educational exhibits throughout Friday. The Saturday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> program consists of multi-hour, in-depth session options focusing on topics such as hops business and marketing, pest and pathogen management, hops food safety and quality, and brewing science. The conference will conclude in the afternoon with a brewery tour and tasting at the newly-opened Sinkland Farms Brewery near Blacksburg. Participants are also invited to tour the Virginia Tech research hopyard on Thursday, March 1<sup>st</sup> prior to the start of the conference.
